Rancho Alegre Construction Update

The three staff residences with garage are now complete. The next phase of construction will be the three staff residences (without garage) adjacent to the Frank Lodge. Building will begin with the SIPS panels (walls and roof) being assembled. Estimated start is mid-February. The new camp water system and sewer system are functioning as planned.

Operations at camp are now on hold due to wet weather. All areas of camp that were graded now have sandbags and fiber rolls to protect the roads from rain run-off and silting. Additionally, parts of camp are too soft to venture on. We have spent a significant amount of time protecting camp with a storm water protection plan.

A big Scout Thank You to Terri, Paul, and Kevin Bowen for their oak tree planting initiative at Rancho Alegre. Early in the month of January when the weather was dry and warm, they watered all the sapling oaks they had planted to keep them going. They have collected and planted 293 acorns for seedlings. To date over 44 trees have been planted.

SAGE Trail Alliance continues to develop the Mountain Bike Trail with extending the route to include a climb portion on a hill. Work will continue when the ground dries out.

Council Dinner Postponed

In order to find a time when we can come together in person, we reluctantly have decided to postpone this year's Council Dinner from the originally scheduled date in March. We anticipate it will be held in mid-to-late summer, possibly at Rancho Alegre to celebrate its progress and our ability to return to the outdoors and return to in-person activities. What I learned in life was taught to me in Scouting.

However, it was Scouting that taught me many life skills and so much more. Let me share some examples;

Flag etiquette. Schools don't teach you how to fold a flag, how to retire a flag, which side of the room and proper hanging of the flag, to remove my hat as the colors were raised or passed by in the parade. To stand and salute and show respect to our country and those who protect our freedoms. Scouting taught me these values in Cub Scouts. Here is an example, I was driving down 101 to Santa Barbara and past our Refugio State Park. At the top of the flagpole was our flag flying upside down which is a sign of distress. That employee was a product of our schools and most likely never a Scout.

Cooking. Every freshman in college should be so lucky and have this skill set. A Scout is Clean, another great skill set going off to college that will earn your respect with future roommates

Civics and Government; yes, school will have you know about the constitution and the bill of rights in history class. However, until you're getting that merit badge and go to a public meeting and see the process, the meaning "of the people, by the people and for the people," means much more than the words.

First Aid. Have you ever come up or see an serious accident? Sure, any of us can call 911 and request help from our cell phone; but knowing first aid and emergency skills allows you to be part of the solution and take action. To my knowledge this is not taught in schools K-12 .

These are just a few examples and there are many more. I am not being derogatory to schools or teachers. Just saying Den Mothers, Scoutmasters and other Scout leaders for your units add so much more and fill the gaps that schools cannot.

The value proposition for being a Scout is greater now more than ever. Enjoy and grow with Scouting for Life.

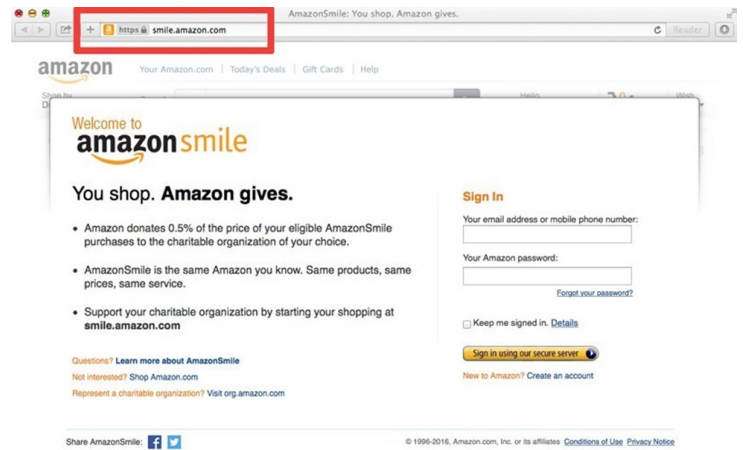
Below are some easy-to-follow instructions to sign up from Bryan on Scouting.

Step 1: Go to smile.amazon.com

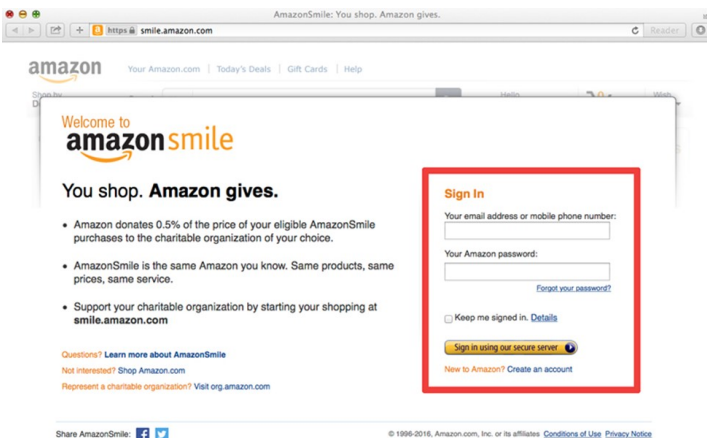
You'll use this link to register *and* for all your future Amazon shopping.

Even after you've signed up for AmazonSmile and selected a charity, shopping through the regular [amazon.com](https://www.amazon.com) won't benefit that charity.

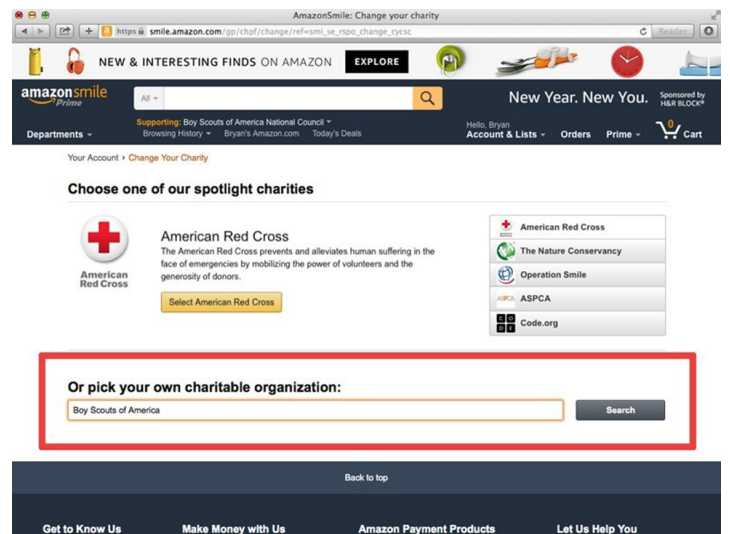
Amazon will remind you from time to time, but it's best to just use the smile.amazon.com link from now on. So you don't forget, use a browser extension (I use the [Smile Always Chrome extension](#)) that will redirect you automatically.



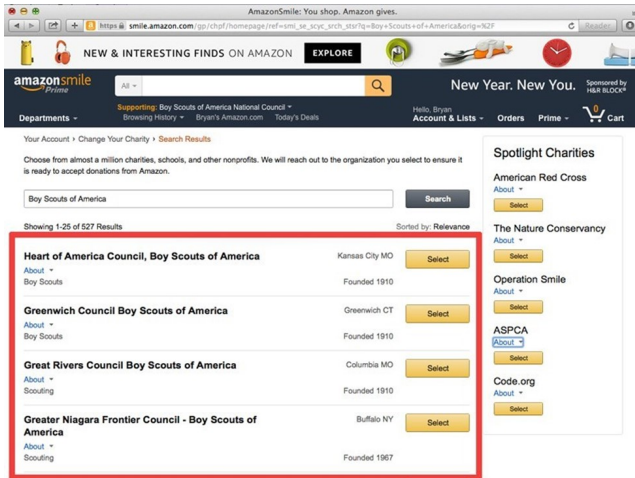
Step 2: Sign in using your normal Amazon login



Step 3: Search for the "Boy Scouts of America"



Step 4: Find your local council



Some are listed by council name and others by headquarters city. That information comes from a national charity database, so any listing you find in there is legitimate.

Charitable organizations must go through a rigorous screening process to be listed here, so you can select with confidence that your purchases are actually supporting your council.

Step 5: Check the top-left corner and start shopping



If you see AmazonSmile in the top left corner and the correct charity in the “Supporting: [Your charity here]” line, you’ve done it right.

Step 6: Double-check that the product you’re buying is eligible



Most items sold by Amazon qualify, but confirm that on the product page. It’ll say “Eligible for AmazonSmile donation.” And this is a good time to triple-check that you see AmazonSmile and the proper charity at the top-left corner.

Step 7: Check out!

This part you should be used to. Purchase the item(s), and smile. You’ve just done a Good Turn for your local council!

Step 8: Check your impact

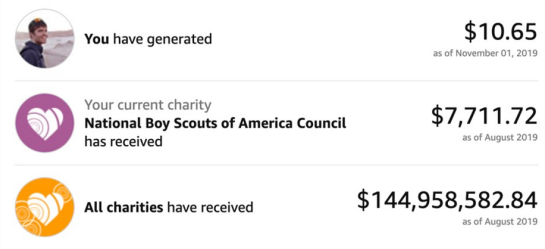
